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




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INTRODUCTION

Some people call Botswana 'the Greatest Show on Earth' due to it having so many of the most superb wildlife spectacles, most stunning scenery, biggest landscapes and deepest cultural experiences found anywhere on the planet. It's home to the world's largest intact inland delta and largest unbroken stretch of sand, plus the huge Kgalagadi Transfrontier Park.



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Botswana was an early adopter of responsible tourism and conservation, and now has over a third of its total land area designated as national parks, reserves and wildlife management areas. This means that truly vast areas are unfenced, allowing animals to roam wild and free, and visitors get the feeling of moving through a single immense natural wonderland.

It's hot and arid for most of the year, and the rains during the summer are hard to predict, torrential, and highly localised. Even so, during winter the extremely dry air means ground water can freeze.



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OVERVIEW

If you picture the Africa that you've seen in sweeping movie scenes, or glimpsed vivid details featured in television documentaries, or even imagine as the setting for classic adventure stories - then you're probably thinking of Botswana. This is a country blessed with spectacular landscapes, teeming with exceptional wildlife. Nowhere else boasts such a range of flora, fauna, environments or experiences.

Our two eight-day itineraries have been made to take you deep into the rugged beauty and lush wilderness of Botswana. Starting from either the East or West of the country, they cover the full, spectacular range of climates, conditions, habitats and sights - and include some thrilling off-road challenges along the way.

If you decide to start East you'll be in for unrivalled, utterly breathtaking scenery. The legendary Victoria Falls is your very first destination, and the beauty of the landscape only escalates from there. If the Western calls to you first, then you'll take a walk on the wild side, with your first activity being a safari to see the majestic Delta Lions, Cape Buffalo, and African Elephants of Moremi Game Reserve.

Whichever way you start out, you're headed straight to the heart of true African splendour and the adventure of a lifetime.





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ACCOMMODATION

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CLIMATE

Botswana is officially subtropical, but this can give people the wrong idea as its climate is more easily characterised as being like a desert, particularly with the very low humidity and accompanying big differences in day and night temperatures. The rains come mostly between December and March, but are unpredictable at the best of times.

The climate inside the parks tends to be more moderate due to the abundance of water, but in the very dry areas, such as the Kalahari, temperatures can easily average at 33°C / 91°F. Given the range of environments in Botswana, from the verdant delta to the desolate plains, it can be hard to characterise it as having any particular average weather. It pays to be prepared for everything in Botswana.

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
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BOTSWANA SAFARI

This is a journey through truly incredible landscapes. You'll witness vast, sweeping vistas that seem to exist on an entirely different scale to the everyday world.





BOTSWANA SAFARI

OKAVANGA DELTA TO VICTORIA FALLS

- Day 1 - Fly into Maun, welcome briefing.
- Day 2 - First day in the Moremi Game Reserve.
- Day 3 - Journey further into the Reserve in search of Botswana's majestic wildlife.
- Day 4 - Final exploration of Khwai Region and Moremi.
- Day 5 - Journey to Chobe National Park, including the Madikwe Sand Dunes.
- Day 6 - Kasane and a majestic Chobe River cruise.
- Day 7 - Across the border to Zimbabwe, the amazing Victoria Falls.
- Day 8 - Breakfast, farewells and departure.

VICTORIA FALLS TO OKAVANGA DELTA

- Day 1 - Arrival in Victoria Falls, welcome briefing and introductions.
- Day 2 - Tour of the falls, Batoka Gorge, shuttle to Chobe.
- Day 3 - Safari boat cruise, introduction to vehicles and briefing.
- Day 4 - Savute area, Chobe National Park, Okavango Delta.
- Day 5 - Deeper into the park, Khwai region.
- Day 6 - Moremi Game Reserve.
- Day 7 - Camping near Southern Moremi, final drive, exploring Maun.
- Day 8 - Breakfast, farewells and departure.

Breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided from day 1 to day 7.
Breakfast will be provided on day 8.

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DAY 1

Read the account of one of our recent guests who was taken by a lifelong love of wildlife, and our team of guides, on an incredible journey from Okavango Delta to Victoria Falls.

Fly into Maun and welcome briefing.

When we landed in Maun, it was the sensory equivalent of jumping in at the deep end. The sights and sounds, the people and climate, all in a huge rush of colour. It was my first time in Africa, and it was everything I hoped for. Maun, although technically a village, is where a lot of Botswana's tourists start from, so the welcome from the locals and the Land Rover team couldn't have been more friendly.

We met the team and were introduced to the vehicles, and then enjoyed pre-dinner drinks along with the first briefing. The local food was delicious, and we retired to our lodge rooms both tired from travelling and fired up for the first adventure.



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DAY 2

First day in the Moremi Game Reserve.

We headed for Moremi Game Reserve for a full day's safari drive. The roads started out paved, but soon gave way to off-road tracks - which was where the Defenders really showed their capabilities. The wildlife I'd come for was present in unbelievable abundance. The lions and elephants I'd waited my whole life to see were right there, free and beautiful and wild.



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DAY 3

Further into the Reserve.

None of us can quite believe the profusion and sheer vibrancy of all the park's flora and fauna. There's so much to see that everyone has a sighting or encounter special to them. My favourite was watching crocodiles and hippos wallow on the riverbanks and pools. We drove across seemingly endless lush grasslands to the eastern side of the Okavango Delta and on to Khwai and our camp for the night.



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DAY 4

Khwai Region and Moremi.

The camp is the base for the day's activities, and we're all finally getting acclimatised enough to the Botswana sensory overload that we can appreciate the smaller things. Beautiful details, like the varied plant life of the area, from the towering Camel Thorn acacia trees to the wonderfully aromatic wild sage. There is still so much to see.



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DAY 5

Chobe National Park and Madikwe dunes.

Today we headed north for the Chobe National Park. The road took us through Mababe Gate and along the Madikwe sand ridge, until we reached Savuti. This is home to Africa's largest elephant population and covers more than 10,000 square kilometers of rich ecosystems. Seeing the elephants at home, free and majestic was deeply moving.

The evening was spent at a camp right in the park which, as well as a delicious African cuisine dinner, included a talk about what to do if we met any of the wildlife walking right through the middle of the camp!



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
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DAY 6

Kasane and Chobe River Cruise.

After breakfast we drove north for Kasane, our next destination and overnight rest. Stopping along the way we enjoyed the open vistas of Botswana, a sumptuous lunch and an amazing sunset boat cruise on the Chobe River. We drifted through the side channels of the river in silence, broken only by birdsong and the splashes and calls of the hippos.



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
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DAY 7

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
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DAY 8
